Small Piecing is F-U-N!!!

Please email Audrey if you want to join a brand new Small Piecing Small Group. I would love to start one with you!

Here is the beginning of my chain piecing - consisting of 160 twopatches, to make 80 four-patch blocks, each finishing at 1" square.

Small piecing is not hard! Mary Elizabeth taught us how to piece with such precision that everyone in the workshop made blocks finishing at exact same size using many different sewing machines, presser feet, and thread!

This class truly helped me push my imagination and stretch my abilities to have the confidence to make these tiny blocks. My smallest patch finishes at 1/2". What is amazing to me is that this piecing can actually happen without error, and without foundation paper.
