# Recap of the November 25 WOW Quilt Guild Meeting:

Angie and Rachel Roberts from Noble Quilter, of Elk River, presented "The Then and Now of Quilting. Angie gave a short history of American quilting from the 1880's to the present. Rachel, Angie's daughter, described her experiences with quilting, growing up in the quilt shop, and designing quilts. When Rachel designs (Rachel Gurl Designs) her quilts, she uses Electronic Quilt 8. She explored the whole process of choosing the fabric, colors, block variation, layout, borders, and her final concept.

#### **Block of the Month:**

I am very excited to share our 2020 Block-of-the-Month Program with you today!

As you know our 2019 Splash of Stars Raffle Quilt was magnificent, and I have received Connie's blessing to recreate a similar quilt for our BOM Program. If you were like me and purchased raffle tickets, you may also want to have this quilt. This is your chance to make your own!

A caveat: Most of the stars on this BOM quilt are Judy Martin EQ8 Stars requiring permissions to copy. I have contacted Judy Martin directly and received her written permission to make 20 copies of each star from her software.

Therefore, I can take up to 20 participants for this Block-of-the-Month Program. If you are interested, please email me now at <u>audrey@thefreshfamily.com</u>. I will take the first 20 people who express their interest starting today through the end of 2019, or until the program is full.

The finished quilt measures 97" x 97". Fabric requirements will be provided at our January 2020 Meeting. For planning purposes now, you will need approx. 7 yards of background fabric, and approx. 2 yards dark blue and 1-1/2 yards green for the outer border. We will make 2 stars per month, January through August, and the borders will be pieced September through November. This is primarily a paper-pieced pattern and will require paper piecing experience.

I have provided two colorways below. The first quilt is multi-colored muted-brights. The second quilt is similar to the raffle quilt. You can choose any colorway you love. Batiks are recommended for the stars and borders to help with paper-piecing.

I know there will be a mystery program in 2020 also. If you feel you cannot participate in this BOM, please know there is another program that you might be interested in.
