Recap of the January WOW Quilt Guild Meeting:

Our first meeting of 2020 began with more than 50 people renewing their membership with WOW. Members were each given a small clip board with details of a points program for earning rewards for such things as wearing the name tag, talking to new members, inviting new people to join them at their table, making and donating service quilts, etc. (the program is described in detail later in the newsletter. Members were also given an opportunity to join a mentoring program.

Sandy Irish, from Irish Chain Pattern Company, showed many of the quilt patterns that she has designed. During Show and Share, 12 people showed quilts they have recently completed. Following a 15-minute break, we began our business meeting by brainstorming ways that WOW members can and do contribute to the community. The meeting continued with approval of the 2020 budget and hearing reports from committees: membership, Secret Quilters, Newsletter, Block of the Month, and Presidential Awards.

Block of the Month:

February Block

Attached is your February Block, the Braced Star. This is a traditionally pieced block. Please make two (2) of these blocks. You will need templates for cutting out your fabric. I provided templates at the January meeting.

Important! If you did not receive the templates at the meeting, please go to this site to print them. If you use the online templates remember to ADD your 1/4" seams to all sides of the templates before cutting out your fabric.

Your BOM Mystery quilt will measure 72" x 86" before borders. You will need 4 yards of background fabric that includes the sashing. There will be (30) 12-1/2 inch unfinished blocks in this quilt (5 across and

6 down). The background fabrics is the same fabric for your 2-1/2" unfinished sashing strips. You can pick a fabric close to your background for your sashing 2-1/2" x 2-1/2" unfinished cornerstones.

All blocks for the WOW BOM Mystery will be traditionally pieced stars. Choose a scrappy light low volume background for each of your blocks if you do not want to use the same yardage for the background.
