## **WOW Quilt Guild Meeting - February 24, 2020**

<u>Social Hour – 6:30-7:00 pm</u> <u>Meeting — 7:00-9:00 pm</u>

## Speaker

Sara Hardwig shared that her mom introduced her to quilting. Her mom had a gift shop in Bemidji and Sara sewed many of the samples for the shop. Sara enjoyed sewing embroidery and cross stitch. Sara enjoys drawing. She later learned to sew with a sewing machine.

Sara's first pattern designed was an embroidery pattern for six small ornaments. She has designed 104 patterns and some are discontinued now. Sara found that quilters like embroidery patterns with good directions.

In 2007, Sara and her mom were both designing patterns and approached by a distributor and they picked up their patterns.

When wool became popular Sara's mom carried wool and wool applique patterns. Sara's mom taught her to applique with wool and Sara designed pattern #18. Sara showed the pattern and sample.

Sara showed more examples of her pattern and samples in a **trunk show** that included:

- Best seller: Trim a tee with snowmen and buttons
- Worst: Kites in Clouds Sara learned she should have set the pattern design aside and come back to it later, rather she than continuing to design it and published the result.
- Sara's patterns often include options: Patchwork forest with applique or embroidery with options to finish it.
- Dish towel patterns (Sara likes these because no finishing needed). An embroidery floss skein has 6 threads and the use of two threads of two colors provides more depth.
- Batting with lightweight loft is placed behind stitches and will hide the stitches too. The use of fusible shape flex SF101 can be fused on and then trace on the pattern.
- Snow birds, sewn mostly with two strands, Sara likes to use different stiches on the same projects.
- Hoop embroidery with buttons, with a saying "We love to stitch..." Consider an oval rather than round hoop.

Embroidery Stitches: Sara described that embroidery stitches she likes are:

- Outline stitch called stem stitch to overlap the stitches
- Backstitch to meet up the stitches for small stitches (Sara likes this stitch)

<u>Floss:</u> Sara suggests using DMC floss because it is easy to get the colors and it is less expensive. Other brands provide variegated colors, e.g., Weeks Dye Works, but it may not be color fast.

<u>Background fabric</u>: Sara likes background fabric from Moda, called "Primitive muslin"

Needle: Sara like size 8 need from Peace Makers brand.

Sara starts with drawing and then stitches "through my window" and provides large finish edges.

Templates: Copy templates with light box:

- Trace with water based marker, dab or spray
- If iron the template, it is hard to get off or use a pigma pen

Sara shared patterns and kits.

## **Meeting Updates and Activities**

- **Fabric Favorites** Kevin shared the results on the survey about favorite fabrics and Batik was the top fabric, and included other favorites of Kaffe Fassett, Tula Pink, Alex Henry, etc.
