Dear WOW Quilt Guild Members and Non-members

In the week before our October meeting, Weeks Ringle and Bill Kerr, of the Modern Quilt Studio made their private You Tube video on the topic of choosing colors for quilts available online to WOW members. In their Zoom presentation to WOW members only on October 26th, they demonstrated how and why they chose fabric styles and colors for many of their modern quilts. After viewing these presentations, WOW members are prepared to choose fabric colors for their own "modern" style quilt projects.

The board applied the unused down payment from the 2019 Quilt Show to partially fund this event.

In the upcoming November 23rd meeting, members will show photos of their entries to the Triangle Quilt Challenge. Also, all members are invited to send photos of their favorite quilted Holiday projects to the WOW Website (wowquiltguild@gmail.com) to be shown during the meeting.

In the future December 14th meeting, Timna Tarr, quilt designer and quilter from Western Massachusetts, will join us via Zoom with her <u>Flying Colors Trunk Show</u>. Timna will offer WOW members yet another perspective on quilt colors and design.

WOW membership for November and December is \$6.00.

As this year ends, the Board is making plans for holding meetings via Zoom for January through March, of next year. (Please note: the speaker schedule for 2021 can be found elsewhere in this newsletter.) All presentations by national speakers will be available to members only.

If you spend the winter in a warmer climate, we want you to know that WOW will continue to offer the Zoom option even when the guild can again hold meetings in person. Speaker schedule for 2020

October 26th

Weeks Ringle and Bill Kerr held an informative question and answer session. Terri asked the questions posed by many of our members, many of whom had previously viewed a private You Tube video from the Modern Quilt Studio. During this online meeting, we will show the Triangle Challenge Quilts made by WOW members. All members are invited to present their favorite holiday craft creations.



December 14th

Timna Tarr comes from a long line of quilters. Her quilts have been featured in exhibits, magazines, and books and on The Quilt Show and Quilting Arts TV. Timna, who lives in South Hadley, MA and works out of her studio in Holyoke, MA, is in-demand across the U.S as a teacher and speaker.

Timna's work spotlights the use of color and small compositions. In her quilts each block stands as its own element, independent of the other blocks. Her goal as a quilter is to arrange small compositions that play off each other and work together to create a larger whole. What keeps her engaged is watching how the project changes and transforms with the addition of each color and texture. Her quilts are contemporary works. That is, they are set in this time and place, and they reference the rich tradition of quilt making. Timna will talk about quilt design, color choices, and the personal stories behind her quilts.



January 25, 2021

Debbie Tonkin started sewing in Junior High to make clothes to fit, as she was already 6 foot tall. Later she sewed clothes for her 3 daughter's when they were young. Timna made her first quilt in her teens with help from her grandmother, and she didn't make her next quilt until about the age of 40. She became hooked on quilting and has since made over 250 quilts. Timna worked at the Glad Creations Quilt Shop in Minneapolis and later managed Just Sew Studio. There she began long arm quilting for customers and teaching sewing, machine embroidery, and quilting.

Debbie will speak about finishing quilts: choosing batting, backing, thread, and quilting design options that will make the most of your quilt.




June 28, 2021
