Weeks Ringle and Bill Kerr from Modern Quilt Studio will be presenting "Rethinking Color" on October 26. (Please note: the requirement for accessing the Weeks Ringle presentation was WOW membership before October 1.) On December 14, Timna Tarr will present "Flying Colors Trunk Show." While these two presentations about color appear similar, the artists have quite different styles of quilting. Both presenters will give you a new perspective for your quilt creations. At our November 23rd meeting, members will share their Triangle Challenge Quilts. WOW members will also display their favorite holiday quilts, table runners, and wall hangings in a Show and Share format.

Upcoming speaker information

Rethinking Color by Modern Quilt Studio, October 26

Weeks Ringle and Bill Kerr are professional quilt makers and co-founders of Modern Quilt Studio, a design studio in Oak Park, Illinois. Having written the first book on Modern Quilting, Bill and Weeks are pioneers of the Modern Quilt Movement. Weeks made her first modern quilt in 1987 to rethink the possibilities of the American quilt as being expressive of the time in which we live. Weeks will be speaking on Rethinking Color in Quilts.

"More than any other topic," say our presenters, "quilters ask us to help them become more confident in their color choices." WOW members will learn color theory, not in a dry technical approach, but as it pertains to quilts. Weeks will explain new ways to combine fabrics, how to build and edit palettes for quilt projects and how color choices change the feel of the finished projects. She will analyze a variety of quilts and explain what makes the chosen colors work successfully in each quilt.

This presentation is open to all members of the WOW Quilt Guild who joined before October 1, 2020. The members will receive a link to watch her one-hour presentation on Rethinking Color a week before our October meeting. On October 26, the WOW Zoom meeting will be held at 7:00pm for a one-hour Question-and-Answer session with Weeks and Kerr. Terri Good will be delivering WOW members' questions to Weeks, based on the questions we submitted before the meeting via email to wwwquiltguild@gmail.com or during the meeting via the chat box. The microphones of all participants except Weeks and Terri will be muted. during the Zoom meeting on October 26.




Timna Tarr, WOW presenter on December 14

Timna Tarr comes from a long line of quilters, but she did not begin quilting until after she studied art history in college. She bought her first longarm in 2001 and began quilting clients' quilts. Many of her own award-winning quilts are in private and corporate collections. Her quilts have been featured in numerous exhibits, magazines, and books and on The Quilt Show and Quilting Arts TV. Timna, who lives in South Hadley, MA and works out of her studio in Holyoke, MA, is in-demand all across the U.S as a teacher and speaker.

Timna's work spotlights the use of color and small compositions. In her quilts each block stands as its own element, independent of the other blocks. Her goal as a quilter is to arrange small compositions that play off each other and still work together to create a larger whole. What keeps her engaged is watching how the project changes and transforms with the addition of each color and texture. Her quilts are contemporary works; that is, they are set in this time and place, and they reference the rich tradition of quilt making.

Timna is known for her fun, colorful, award-winning quilts. WOW members may join her for a presentation of her quilting journey in which she talks about quilt design, color choices, and the personal stories behind her quilts. (Flying Colors Trunk Show 45-60 minutes).
