There she began long arm quilting for customers and teaching sewing, machine embroidery, and quilting. Debbie will speak about finishing quilts: choosing batting, backing, thread, and quilting design options that will make the most of your quilt.

2021 Quilt Show

It is Quilt Show Year! WOW's next quilt show is planned for October 15, 2021, at the Maple Grove Community Center. Our current plan is to include members' quilts, a boutique, two venders, a Community Service display, and the Block of the Month quilts from 2020.

The Quilt Show Committee is seeking WOW member volunteers to organize the venders, the boutique, and the hanging of the quilts. If you are interested in volunteering for one of these positions, you will be required to attend 3 or 4 organizational meetings. Please contact me through our gmail account at www.uitguild@gmail.com

The WOW Board has determined that WOW members paying the full membership of \$30 for 2021 will be eligible to enter two quilts in the quilt show. Every fully paid WOW member is invited to enter one large quilt (over 50" wide) and one small quilt (under 50" wide) in the quilt show. Members paying partial membership dues will be asked to pay a minimal fee to enter their quilts.

The Raffle Quilt for this year requires paper piecing skills. Linda Waterman will be demonstrating paper piecing in two Coffee Shops: January 16 at 10am and January 19 at 7pm. She will have the technique perfected for our special blocks, and if we follow her instructions, the results will be spectacular. The goal is for all members to participate in the construction of the blocks. Kits will be distributed through a prearranged pick-up at either of two locations: the Cub parking lot at a date and time during the last week in January or at Four Seasons on February 13.

Boutique- As we are all staying at home, it's a good time to begin making boutique items. A while ago we asked you to respond to a survey question regarding the strongest selling items that you recommend making for the boutique. Here are your recommendations items listed in order of importance:

- Seasonal items, such as Halloween table runners
- Items for children
- Gnomes, gnome tree toppers, and gnome tree ornaments
- Microwave bowls
- Placemat sets
- Basket liners
