# Speaker schedule for 2022

#### January 24, 2022

Stacy Horton, of The Quilting Grounds in Norwood Young America, will demonstrate paper piecing using Tula Pink designs and fabrics. #### February 28, 2022

Melanie Schatz-Pattay, who is an Art teacher at St. Cloud High School, will provide slides and video clips on "How Batiks are Made." She will talk about using Batik fabrics in projects and inspire us to be creative with our quilting.

#### March 28, 2022

Peter Byrne's "Behind the Seams" presentation will take viewers through his personal quilting journey. He will share quilts and include "how to" pictures of his quilt-making process, along with "close ups" of every quilt! He starts with his experience of winning "Best in Show" and "Best Machine Quilting Frameless" at QuiltCon 2020. His projects go back to the first quilts he made in 2009 and forward to 2017, when he became a full time student of the craft and joined the Toronto Modern Quilt Guild. He will walk us through the quilts he made in 2017 and 2018, as he developed his quilting skills, and follow by showing a new approach to raw edge appliqué, which he calls "Hover-quilting." ## Seeking Volunteers for the 2022 WOW Board of Directors

WOW Board of Director positions are available. We welcome every member to get involved and need volunteers to help lead the guild and ensure rich programming for everyone.

Positions are described below. If a position describes you, please volunteer! If a position describes a friend, please nominate that person! New members are encouraged - if you have a friend who is not a member, is interested in quilting, and may be looking to volunteer, ask them to join and nominate them. Positions can be shared, and you can partner with a friend.

- President: Presides over monthly member and board meetings, promotes the guild. Requires leadership, inclusivity, courage, conviction, and organization skills. 1 year term.
- Vice President: In charge of programming. Requires networking and outreach, relationship-building. 1 year term.
- Treasurer: Manages accounts payable and receivable, financial reporting and annual budget preparation. Requires finance/accounting skills, organization, integrity. 2 year term.
- Secretary: Records minutes for member and board meetings. Requires good written communication skills, listening, organization. 1 year term.
- Newsletter Chair: Prepares monthly newsletter. Requires good written communication skills, editing and design, attention to detail. 2 year term.
- Membership Chair: Maintains current roster of members, handles attendance and other member reporting. Requires organization skills, networking and relationship building. 1 year term.
- Activity/Community/Charity Chair: Coordinates with guild clubs, community outreach/activity and charity donations. Requires love of service, relationship building, outreach, organization. 2 year term.
- Data/Technology Chair: In charge of meeting technology, website, distribution lists and social media. Requires technical/system/data aptitude, patience. 2 year term.

NOTE: The Quilt Show Chair position is not included in the above role descriptions as 2022 is not a quilt show year.
